





The Sidmouth Folk Festival is a national cultural treasure in the UK events calendar. Not only the longest running folk festival in the country - showcasing the best in folk music, dance and song each year in the first week of August since 1955 - but also distinctive in its diverse week-long programme taking place throughout the stunning East Devon seaside resort. The venues, streets and seafront literally burst into life with colourful dance displays, dawn 'til dusk festive atmosphere and music ringing in the air.

The 69th year kicks off in style with two Pre-Festival concerts at The Ham with Cornwall's best-known sea-themed musical export The Fisherman's Friends on Thursday 3rd August 7.30pm and award-winning Scottish singer Barbara Dickson with Nick Holland, in a special acoustic performance on Friday 4th August

Fisherman's Friends

Cornwall's best-known musical export, chart-topping singing sensations, film stars and Sidmouth favourites, this force of salty song always put on a great show!

Having got together more than 30 years ago to sing sea shanties on the Platt in their native Port Isaac, The Fisherman's Friends gatecrashed the charts with a Top 10 album in 2010 and went on to sing at the late Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations, play Glastonbury and land the Good Tradition Award at the BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards. Their story has been the subject of an ITV documentary and best-selling book, as well as an acclaimed stage musical. Not to mention the hit movie from 2019 and last year saw them become the first British band since The Beatles to have a second feature film made about them.





FAQs

Where is Sidmouth?

Sidmouth is on the East Devon 'Jurassic' Coast, just a few miles from junction 30 of the M5. The nearest stations are at Exeter or Honiton with regular bus services into Sidmouth.

The Festival is held throughout the Regency Town using a wide variety of seated & standing venues.

Transport and Parking

Car parks are available at the Cricket and Rugby Clubs and Bedford Lawn (all festival sponsors), as well as The Ham and Manor Road. The Official Festival Car Park is next to The Bulverton: a short walk down the hill takes you to the Campsite bus stop and into town. The Festival Buses provide a timetabled service from the Campsite (near to The Bulverton) to the Town Centre and also include a regular service via town supermarkets.



Festival Campsite

The Festival Campsite is located about 1.5 miles from the seafront, on Bulverton Road, B3176, with great views across the valley.

Facilities include trailer toilets, as well as portaloos, showers and washing up sinks, plus a convenient Hub area with box office, delicious festival catering, a campsite office and a useful general meeting area.

We have a designated quieter family camping area, and the accessibility area of the campsite is available to pre-book – simply contact access@sidmouthfolkfestival.co.uk after purchasing your ticket.

The Festival Campsite is available to all those attending the Festival with tents, motorhomes and caravans. Festival Ticket holders get a preferential rate and should book in advance. Those without a ticket can stay at the Campsite at the higher non ticket (NT) rate. Children 5 and under are free with an adult camping ticket. Under 18s must be booked with a responsible adult.

The Campsite is open from noon on Wednesday August 2nd and closes at noon on Saturday 12th August.



Accessibility

We try to make the Festival as accommodating as possible to all. The Main Programme and website contains details venue accessibility in July and our volunteer stewards are always ready to assist with any special needs. We offer free Personal Assistant tickets those requiring assistance to attend the festival.
